

XIV Jornadas APDIS

- 29 and 30 October -

Be OPEN: Inspire, Capacitate, Research, Innovate & Share

The Jornadas APDIS will take place in an online format, through the Zoom platform, on the 29th & 30th October 2020. The opening conference will be given by an invited keynote speaker and the thematic sessions will be presented according to the following themes:

1 - Health Literacy (Empower)

As health information professionals, this section aims to promote health literacy at a population, organization and system level. Through the engagement and collaboration of stakeholders, the strengthening of the governance and the creation of enabling environments for improving global and lifelong health literacy – including literacy both on the influence of psychological factors and on the surrounding social environment on health – the aim is to develop policy options on public health by reducing health inequalities.

2 - Open Health Science (Share)

Directed to the health field, the section on Open Health Science, is understood as a science practice that fosters collaboration and contributions, where scientific data, laboratory notes, and other research processes are freely available (in terms that allow reuse, redistribution, and research reproduction, as well as of its underlying data and methods).

3 - New roles for information professionals (Innovate)

It is expected the definition of a new profile, the characteristics, and skills that the health information librarian should have in this challenging Open Science context, and the best library profile and characteristics with the aim of providing quality services and advice, without restrictions and directed to all kind of users.

4 - Health Information Research (Researching)

This section reviews the role, characteristics, and behavior of the factors involved in conducting scientific and academic research under the concept of Open Science and its repercussions on the functions and services offered by the library.

5 - Health Communication (Inspire)

Health communication, crosscutting in different contexts (health services, workplaces, community) and with different contents (about use of services, behaviors, risk management, etc.), is an alignment in which different strategies mingle aiming the development of technical skills and the users' empowerment.

6 - Open Health Data (Share)

The open health data section aims to clarify the rationale that affects the free or restricted search and use of health data, including specialized information, as well as to reflect on the ideal and desirable conditions that ensure the best use of these resources, taking ethical and relevance considerations into account.
